

First and Foremost – how are you going to set up your system for easy retrieval? Here is my own system using Dropbox:

- 1. Within Dropbox I have set up family folders. (example below) 2. All documents, photos, research, etc. are placed within those folders.
- 3. Begin a labeling system that will be easy for you to follow, as well as those coming after you.





To make it easy to find photos and documents:

• Record them by the last name, birth and death, a brief title of document. Example



Lauritzen, Peggy Clemens b1955 dxxxx, 1977 Wedding photo





Begin now to fix any "hanging" documents. Use a simple word processor and make a template such as this. This way **the citation always accompanies the document or photo.**



Now go to FamilySearch.


- In the tabs across the top click on "Memories".
- The green "plus sign" in the middle will allow you to upload photos and documents.
- It may be 20 minutes to 24 hours for them to be approved. Then they can be tagged. OR
- Go to a person's homepage.
- The "Memories" will be under their name.
- After approval, you can begin to tag both photos and documents. Each time a person is tagged, it will appear on their page.
- Stories and audio files can also be added.





FamilySearch Mobile Apps

- On your mobile phone, search for the menu. It may be different for Apple products and Android devices.
- Click on "Memories" The illustration below is from a Samsung phone.

 - · Clothing, rites
 - · Patriarchal blessings
- Cross-dressing
- Links to outside websites
- Obscene or profane words
- Body shots without head/face
- Images of people kissing
 - Kissing on lips/mouth, or about to kiss
- Product endorsements

- · Illegal acts, products or services
- · Vulgarity of any kind
- Expressions of hatred or discrimination
- Violence
- Racism
- Promotions of products, causes or charities
- · Commercial content
